AMERICA NEEDS FATIMA

PRAY A PUBLIC SQUARE ROSARY: At the end of WWII, Communist Soviet troops occupied Vienna, Austria. After massive public Rosary processions led by Fr. Petrus Pavlicek the Communist invaders left. Large scale public Rosaries were credited for foiling a Communist takeover in Brazil in 1964. If the Rosary saved these countries, it can save America. We will pray in public on **Saturday, October 14th, 12:00 Noon** at the **Haywood County Courthouse in Waynesville.** This commemorates the 100th Anniversary of the Miracle of the Sun, *when on Oct. 13, 1917 Our Lady performed a miracle witnessed by 70,000 people, including atheists, communists and anti-Catholics, some of them converted.* We pray for 1 hr. from prayer cards provided by Fatima. All over the USA, more than 20,000 Rosary Rallies will be praying the Public Square Rosary on this day. There will be a red rose placed in Fatima, Portugal that day for our participation.
