Priest Retirement & Benefits

As of July, there are roughly 130 priests serving the People of God across the 92 parishes and missions in the Diocese of Charlotte (90 diocesan priest and 40 priests from nine religious orders). When it comes time for them to retire, the diocese wants to ensure they are taken care of since we have been richly blessed by their service through the years.

Bishop Peter Jugis has said, "These priests will continue to serve the people of our diocese. They will visit the sick in nursing homes and hospitals. They will go to our prisons where they will counsel the inmates. Retired priests pray daily for the people of the diocese, offer Mass for the intentions of parishioners, and give of their time and talent to help with weekend Masses and confessions in parishes throughout the diocese."

The bishop asks the faithful to respond with grateful hearts to the needs of these priests who so faithfully serve us by generously contributing to a second collection held each year in all parishes shortly after the Eucharistic Congress.

The parish of St. Margaret of Scotland is currently **\$1,630 under** this year's assessment. Just as any shortfall we incur with the annual Diocesan Support Appeal assessment must come out of parish funds, any amount we fall short for the Priest Retirement & Benefits Collection is covered the same way. Please prayerfully consider your monetary contribution to this extremely important diocesan fund.
