

#### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today, Pentecost Sunday, is called by many the birthday of the Church. Not only does the Lord imbue His followers and Apostles with the Holy Spirit, but He sends them out into the world to accomplish and further His mission.

There are strong connections to the concept of stewardship throughout the readings on this day, including the statement by St. Paul in his letter to the Corinthians, "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." That is a prompt to us that we are gifted in different ways, but we are to be willing to use those gifts to assist and support the Church and others.



Nevertheless, in the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles is also a reminder to us about living a stewardship way of life. They are celebrating Pentecost, 50 days after Passover (which, for us, is Easter). Passover (as reported in the Book of Numbers in the Old Testament) was a time when the first sheaf reaped from the barley harvest was presented to God; however, at Pentecost the first fruits of the wheat harvest were given to God.

This concept of giving the first fruits to God is at the heart of steward-ship. How do we share the bounty that has been given us? The people of Jesus' time were deeply conscious of all their gifts, including the gifts of the earth. Everything we have comes from God. This is a day to contemplate that and to respond to it.

#### **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Happy Birthday to the Church! Thank God we have it! The Mass schedule advertised in the bulletin and on our website remains intact with the exception of the 8AM Sunday Mass. The 10AM Mass has been full the past two weeks, but until we get substantially more than 20 or 25 people at the 4PM Vigil, a third Sunday liturgy does not prove necessary. Also, only the



10AM Sunday Mass will be live streamed on Facebook (probably until the obligation to attend Mass is reinstated by the bishop).

If you remember, prior to the Holy Hour on First Fridays, I had begun to offer another Mass just a few months before we went under stay-at-home orders. While I was pleased to learn that a monthly Holy Hour had been a fixture at St. Margaret's when I became pastor, I was a little disappointed by how lightly attended it was. I wondered if it was because it occurred later in the evening. Sensitive to the preference of most parishioners that liturgies and events be held earlier in the day; going forward, the additional First Friday Masses will be celebrated at 4PM with the Holy Hour immediately to follow (roughly 4:30-5:30PM). This change takes effect this week, Friday, June 5th.

Also beginning this week, I will again be available for confession during all regularly scheduled times. As a reminder, confessions are heard 30 minutes prior to each weekday Mass, 3PM Saturdays, and 9AM Sundays. As always, one can also make an appointment.

I am also available for the Anointing of the Sick if you or someone you know is in need of this sacrament. Simply call the office,
