PARISH MEMBERSHIP: Welcome to St. Margaret of Scotland Catholic Church! We are grateful for your worshipping with us. If you regularly attend Mass here in Maggie Valley, you are encouraged to register in the parish at the office during the week. Please note that a family must be registered at St. Margaret's in order for their children to be enrolled in our religious education program.

MARRIAGE: A new set of guidelines for weddings at St. Margaret's has been issued and is posted on the parish website. Please note that only those who have connection with this parish (such as being a member, or the child of a member) may get married here. Weddings are not normally scheduled during Advent or Lent because of the penitential nature of those seasons.

VISITING THE SICK: Please call the parish office to arrange for Communion or for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.

DAILY MORNING AND EVENING PRAYER: Morning Prayer is read at 7:20 am daily, and Evening Prayer is read at 5:00 pm daily. Books are available for those who wish to participate; all are welcome.

DAILY MASS: Mass is offered at 8:00 am daily. Mass on Saturday morning is from the Book of Divine Worship - The Missal.

LIVESTREAMING: Daily Morning Prayer, Daily Evening Prayer, and Mass (both daily and Sunday) are available on our website by clicking on the link "Watch", or on the YouTube Channel. All streamed services are recorded and available in the St. Margaret of Scotland-Maggie Valley, NC YouTube Channel archive approximately 24 hrs after broadcast.

Easter Egg Hunt and Blessing of Food Baskets at 3:00PM Holy Saturday: Faith Formation is collecting *individually wrapped candy* for an Easter Egg hunt on Holy Saturday. Please no eggs, as we have plenty! There is a basket in the narthex for contributions.

Baskets containing a sampling of Easter foods are brought to church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. The basket is traditionally lined with a white napkin and decorated with sprigs of evergreen. The three-part blessing prayers specifically address the various contents of the baskets, with special prayers for the meats, eggs, cakes and breads. The priest then sprinkles the individual baskets with holy water and incense. The foods in the baskets have a symbolic meaning: eggs - symbolize life and Christ's resurrection; bread - symbolic of Jesus; lamb - represents Christ; salt - represents purification; horseradish - symbolic of the bitter sacrifice of Christ; ham or sausage - symbolic of great joy and abundance.
