**DAILY MASS:** Mass is offered at 8:00AM daily. Mass on Saturday morning is taken from the *Book of Divine Worship: The Missal*.

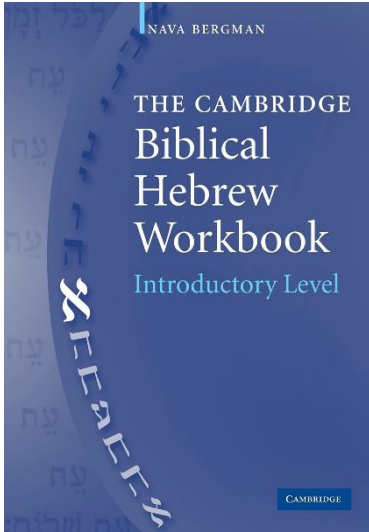
