MEMBERSHIP: Welcome to St. Margaret of Scotland Catholic Church! We are grateful for your worshipping with us. If you regularly attend Mass here in Maggie Valley, you are encouraged to register in the parish at the office during the week.

DAILY MORNING AND EVENING PRAYER: Daily Morning Prayer is at 7:20 AM and Daily Evening Prayer is at 5:00 PM, according to the *Book of Divine Worship*. Books are available for those who wish to participate; all are welcome. **DAILY MASS** is celebrated at 8:00 AM. Mass on Saturday morning is taken from the *Book of Divine Worship: The Missal*.

BREAKFAST WITH BECKET: after the 8:00AM Mass on **Wednesday, 24 April in the Parish Hall** with Exodus 21. What specific rules for slavery are mentioned here? In what ways are these statutes different than most cultures' view of slavery? Why do you think God allows slavery instead of abolishing it? What is the root cause of slavery? What was the penalty for murder? Did God make any differentiation between levels of murder? How serious is it to strike or curse a parent? What was the penalty for injuring another person in a fight and causing that person to miss time at work? What was the penalty for striking a pregnant woman? Taking the context into account, what would the penalty be if the unborn child was harmed or died?

AQUINAS CIRCLE will be on **Tuesday, 23 April** in the Parish Hall at 4:00 PM. **IaIIae q. 9: The causes of the will.** What leads us to act voluntarily? Can we speak of there being causes of actions that we will? Why do we act the way we do? Join us on Tuesday to find out!

Classes in Biblical **HEBREW** will resume on **Thursday, 25 April 2024** in the Parish Hall at 4:00 PM. No previous language study is necessary.
