BREAKFAST WITH BECKET will meet on **Wednesday, 17 July, 8:45 am** in the Parish Hall with Exodus 32: *The Golden Calf (Part One)*. The preceding chapters of Exodus have concentrated on the specific instructions for the construction of the Tabernacle and the consecration of the Priests so that God might dwell among His people and be worshiped correctly. What did the manufacturing of the golden calf demonstrate about Aaron and the people? Why did the people demand the making of something physical to worship? What does the Israelites' demand for gods reveal about their spiritual state? How does Aaron's response to the people's demand reflect his leadership? In what ways do we sometimes replace God with our own 'golden calves' in our lives? Come and see the construction of the LEGO® Tabernacle!

what we will-"outward acts" as Aquinas calls them. For example, he insists that the goodness or badness of outward acts depends on the kind of acts they are and on the end we have when intending them. He holds that good intention alone does not make what we do good and that being physically thwarted as one tries to do something does not mean that one is not willing badly. Join us on Tuesday and look at this distinction more closely.
