AQUINAS CIRCLE will meet on **Tuesday, July 23** in the Parish Hall at 4:00 PM. **IaIae q. 21: Corollaries to Moral Acts**. As he concludes this section on the Principles of Morality, Aquinas briefly offers a series of what we might think of as terminological remarks bearing on "good" and "bad" as

adjectives applied to human actions. Do the words "good" and "bad" mean what "right" and "sinful" mean? Is a sinful act nothing but a blameworthy act? Is a human act meritorious (or otherwise) just because it is good or bad? Is a human action meritorious (or otherwise) just in virtue of its being good or bad *in God's eyes*? These are the questions discussed in 1a2ae, q. 21; join us on Tuesday and look at this distinction more closely.

Biblical **HEBREW** will meet **on Thursday, July 25** in the Parish Hall at 4:00 PM. No previous language study is necessary.
