MEMBERSHIP: Welcome to St. Margaret of Scotland Catholic Church! We are grateful for your worshipping with us. If you regularly attend Mass here in Maggie Valley, you are encouraged to register in the parish at the office during the week.

DAILY MORNING AND EVENING PRAYER: Daily Morning Prayer is at 7:20 AM and Daily Evening Prayer is at 5:00 PM, according to the *Book of Divine Worship*. **DAILY MASS** is celebrated at 8:00 AM. Mass on Saturday morning is taken from the *Book of Divine Worship: The Missal*.

BREAKFAST WITH BECKET will meet on **Wednesday, August 7, 8:45 am** in the Parish Hall with Exodus 34: *New Tablets of Stone*. Why did Moses need to cut out more stone tablets? What does this show us about God's character? How does God describe Himself? Why was Moses face shining? What does this tell us about his interaction with God? How might our lives be different after spending time with God? Will people be able to notice this difference as they did with Moses? In what way do we "shine" before others? Come and see the construction of the LEGO® Tabernacle!

AQUINAS CIRCLE will meet on **Tuesday, August 6** in the Parish Hall at 4:00 PM. **IaIIae q. 23: Classification of the Emotions**. Aquinas, working from Latin translations of Aristotle, maintains that there are two basic types of emotions: "concupiscible" (*concupiscibilis*) and "aggressive" (*irascibilis*). His concupiscible/aggressive distinction is intended to acknowledge that some human emotions arise as we desire or dislike certain things, while others arise as we find obstacles in our way as we go about desiring or disliking things. Join us on Tuesday and look at these distinctions more closely.

Biblical **HEBREW** will meet **on Thursday, August 8** in the Parish Hall at 4:00 PM. No previous language study is necessary.

KITCHEN ASSISTANT & KITCHEN MANAGER/HEAD COOK needed at Living Waters Catholic Reflection Center. Kitchen Assistant: Assists the Kitchen Manager in food preparation, baking of desserts, dining room set-up, dishwashing and general clean-up. Hours vary but must be available on weekends from Friday afternoon thru Sunday afternoon. Time will be made available to attend Mass on Saturday Afternoons. The person

will need to be available several times a year for mid-week retreats. Minimum age: 18. **Kitchen Manager/Head Cook:** The applicant must possess prior experience in manager-level skills for meal planning, meal preparation, and overall responsibility for kitchen/dining operations. Individuals must be able to prepare meals for from 10-65 guests. Applicant should be available for weekend schedules, as well as for mid-week events. The person will be responsible for preparing "fresh" food for each meal. Meals will consist of: Breakfast (8:30am) Lunch: (12:30 pm) and Dinner (5:00 pm). Individuals must comply with all Local, County, and State Health Codes in food preparation and kitchen facility operations.
