AQUINAS CIRCLE will meet on **Tuesday, August 27** in the Rectory Living Room at 4:00 PM. **Ia||ae q. 25: How emotions are mutually related.** Aquinas regards the emotions as relatable to each

other in different ways. He also seems to favor the conclusion that we can only make sense of some emotions in the light of other ones; he argues that love is the primary emotion, since everything is drawn to good rather than evil, but then Aquinas argues that hope is its counterpart. This claim may seem odd since you might think that hope is hardly an emotion at all and that it is not in any way aggressive. More on this next week.
