MEMBERSHIP: Welcome to St. Margaret of Scotland Catholic Church! We are grateful for your worshipping with us. If you regularly attend Mass here in Maggie Valley, you are encouraged to register in the parish at the office during the week.

DAILY MORNING AND EVENING PRAYER: Daily Morning Prayer is at 7:20 AM and Daily Evening Prayer is at 5:00 PM, according to the *Book of Divine Worship*. **DAILY MASS** is celebrated at 8:00 AM. Mass on Saturday morning is taken from the *Book of Divine Worship: The Missal*. **Please check the calendar for schedule changes.**

BREAKFAST WITH BECKET will meet on **Wednesday, 30 October at 8:45 am** in the Rectory Living Room, *continuing with Leviticus 5: The Guilt Offering*. What does this passage teach us about the nature of sin? How does the concept of restitution in this passage relate to making amends in the modern world? How might the dynamics of sin and guilt offerings inform our understanding of forgiveness? What lessons can we learn from the passage about confronting our own wrongdoings, even when they're unintentional? In what ways can we make spiritual "offerings" in today's world? How does this passage challenge our understanding of the consequences of our actions, intentional or not?

AQUINAS CIRCLE will meet on **Tuesday, 29 October** in the Rectory Living Room at 4:00 PM. **IaIIae q. 34: The morality of pleasure.** Unsurprisingly, Aquinas argues that pleasure is not necessarily evil and to be shunned. Some pleasures are good, he says, even if some are not, and there is pleasure that consists in the enjoyment of God in the beatific vision. At the same time, though, Aquinas also thinks that one can be judged morally good or evil in terms of what one finds pleasurable, good deeds or evil ones. See how that can be so this Tuesday.

Biblical **HEBREW** will meet next on **Thursday, 7 November** in the Rectory at 4:00 PM. No prior language experience required.

ALL SAINTS' DAY: Friday, 1 November 2024 is the Feast of All Saints; this year in the United States it is a Holy Day of Obligation. In addition to the usual 8:00 AM Mass, Mass will be at 6:00 PM.

ALL SOULS' DAY: Beginning 2 November and for thirty days afterwards, Masses will be said for the repose of the souls of the names submitted. **Envelopes are available to include the names of the faithful departed; these may be placed in the collection or turned in to the parish office.** The envelopes will be on the altar for thirty days; the names and special prayers will be on a prayer card for All Souls' Day. Names must be in the parish office by **Wednesday, 30 October.**
