BREAKFAST WITH BECKET will meet on **Wednesday, 6 November** at **8:45 am** in the Rectory Living Room, *continuing with Leviticus 6: The Guilt Offering*. Leviticus 6:1-3 lists sins that require a guilt offering, including stealing, lying, and extorting from a neighbour. What does this passage teach us about the nature of sin and the importance of owning up to our actions? How can we apply the principles of restitution in our daily

lives? What does the continual fire on the altar symbolize in our spiritual life? How does the process of guilt offering reflect the gravity of our sins?

AQUINAS CIRCLE will meet on **Tuesday, 5 November** in the Rectory Living Room at 4:00 PM. **Ia IIae q. 35: Pain and Sorrow**. Aquinas takes pain (*dolor*) to be an emotion. He also takes sorrow or sadness (*tristitia*) to be one. We have seen that Aquinas distinguishes between pleasure and joy. Correspondingly, he distinguishes between pain and sorrow by arguing that sorrow results from understanding or imagination of some kind rather than from what impacts us at a



sensory level and might therefore cause us pain. As pleasure stands to joy, Aquinas argues, pain stands to sorrow or sadness. See how that can be so this Tuesday.



Biblical **HEBREW** will meet next on **Thursday, 7 November** in the Rectory at 4:00 PM. No prior language experience required.
