FROM THE PASTOR

Our Catholic lives, graced by our baptism into the death of the Lord Jesus, are lives of prayer and service. On the day of our Baptism, we were graced with the Holy Spirit and anointed with the Sacred Chrism on the crowns of our heads. The gates of heaven prepared for us. Anointed, and confident in God's love, mercy and compassion, let us rededicate ourselves to his holiness, let us be remorseful and renounce our own sinfulness that we may share life with God forever.

For Jesus came not as a warrior king or powerful angel, but as one who we can confidently call our brother. He came not to condemn the world, but to give the world life, and more of it. What did Jesus say to all whom he met? We heard it in today's gospel; "Repent, for the Kingdom of God is at Hand."

Our Christian lives need to lives of constant discernment and conversion. Regularly, we should carefully assess our lives, and if need be, go to confession. For our health, we need periods of daily reflection and prayer. Vacations and retreats should be planned with plenty of quiet time built in, vacations should not leave us more worn out than we started, but refreshed and ready to start anew.

The real danger in our lives is that we become numb to our personal sin, we rationalize the sin away, we pretend it is not there. But it is, our sin wounds our souls, it pierces our hearts, it drags us down into the darkness. What Jesus calls us to do is "Repent, for the Kingdom of God is at hand". We should be very careful that we do not become comfortable in our sinfulness.

Our initiation in the church empowers us to participate in the Sacraments of Penance and the Anointing of the Sick. The real forgiveness of our sins, which only Jesus can accomplish, becomes the source of the joy of our lives. Jesus calls us to share in his Father's mission, Jesus sends us out into the world on a mission of forgiveness. We do this not so much by our words, but more powerfully by our loving actions by our service to others.

Yes, we are sinners, but in faith we trust in the mercy and the power of God in our lives. "Lord only say the word, and I shall be healed." It is in our forgiving others, that God forgives us. Retribution and revenge are tools of Satan. And how does he coo with delight when he adds up his destruction in our world. Our acts of Charity, that is reaching out to others, truly help heal the wounds on our souls from our own foolishness, our own sinfulness.

For we are Anointed, and confident in God's love, mercy and compassion, let us rededicate ourselves to his holiness, let us be remorseful and renounce our own sinfulness. To follow Jesus is to offer our gifts to one another.
