FROM THE PASTOR

The Holy Spirit of God teaches us about and is the fundamental agent of peace. The teaching of Jesus to his Apostles is given to us in the Gospels. Jesus is the fulfillment of the Prophets and the eternal Word of God made flesh. Anyone who teaches anything in contradiction to what Jesus revealed and taught us is a liar or foolish. The false teachers are the anti-Christ that the seer John in the Book of Revelation refers. So be aware and carefully listen to the precepts and values other World Philosophies and Religions may try to teach. You will not hear much about Jesus.

Take care to avoid those who teach heresy. Those who reject Catholic teaching, some who may even try to call themselves Catholic, but they teach their own human opinions with hope that people will like them. Listen closely, all the pieces will not add up to a whole, because what is being said is not the whole truth.

In our quiet prayer and as we learn about our faith, it is the Voice of the Holy Spirit, the gentle voice of Jesus which we hear. We may not physically hear anything at all in the silence, but we begin to understand. We begin to understand that Jesus wants us to be one in him, one in his Truth.

Know that all creation is good, all things naturally work together according to the will of God. It is man's sinfulness, it is his disobedience to God's Will that is evil, that distorts the good of creation. Living and substantiating sinful lives, with no intention of repentance is the fertile ground of division, mistrust, and hatred.

Our peace, given to us by the Holy Spirit is more than lack of war. It is unity. Christ the living Son of God, the glorified Son of Mary, Christ alone is our peace.
