IRISH PALLOTTINE FATHERS MISSION APPEAL

On the weekend of June 27/28, Fr. Denis O'Brien S.A.C. will visit our parish to speak at all the Masses about the missionary work of the Irish Pallottine Fathers in Tanzania, Kenya and Colombia. A second collection will be taken up to support their work of evangelization and development in these struggling countries. Please be generous in your support of their missionary outreach.

The Pallottine Fathers were founded in Rome in 1835. Their name is derived from the family name of their founder, Saint Vincent Pallotti. He was a priest of the Diocese of Rome. He founded this religious community to promote the revival of faith and charity in the work by encouraging the apostolate of the laity and through the extension of the missionary work of the church. He died in 1850 and was canonized by Pope Saint John XXIII on January 20, 1963. Today, Father Denis serves in Colombia. He is looking forward to sharing his missionary experiences and his thoughts on the challenges of evangelization.

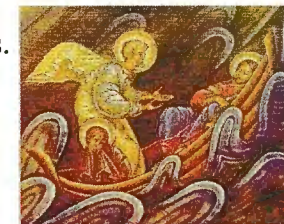

STEWARDSHIP BULLETIN REFLECTION

Life, by its very nature, is filled with storms. In more than one Biblical account, we hear about Jesus calming a storm. Today's Gospel from St. Mark reports one of these incidents. Jesus is asleep in a boat carrying the Apostles across the Sea of Galilee.



Presumably the storm was raging and was loud, but the Lord does not awaken. We might also imagine that the Apostles are yelling and making noise in an effort to combat the terrible weather, but that does not awaken Jesus. Certainly water in rain and waves is splashing on and into the boat, but He continues to sleep. However, when they call to Him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus wakes up immediately and responds to the problem.

In the midst of the storms of our lives, we need to take the time to turn to God and ask for help. The Lord will respond. When He does, we need to be prepared for the same question He poses to His Apostles, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" We must think of the many times in our lives when the Lord has blessed us, and kept us. Our faithful response to this love should be increased trust and a sense of stewardship of the gifts with which we have been blessed.
